Background

- Based on task force recommendations, the Steering Committee acknowledged GMI would benefit from more Partners having access to broader leadership opportunities.
- Corresponding changes have been made to the GMI Terms of Reference:
 - Co-Chairs serve two-year terms with possibility of extension.
 - Co-Chairs would be encouraged to host one Steering Committee meeting per two-year term in their country.
 - Ideally seek balance of Co-Chairs from a developed country and developing country.



Leadership

- Transition from Current Chair:
 - United States will continue to serve as the Steering Committee Chair until new Co-Chairs are selected.
 - U.S. EPA will continue to host the ASG, even after new Co-Chairs are established.
- Call for Expressions of Interest:
 - ASG issued a call to GMI Steering Committee
 Partners to express interest in the Co-Chair positions with no response to-date.

Leadership (con't)

- Potential Process for Identifying/Selecting Co-Chairs:
 - Authorize the ASG to actively recruit GMI Partners to consider the Co-Chairmanship roles.
 - Establish a task force to develop a selection/ recruitment process for new Co-Chairs.
 - Develop a nomination process by which countries could nominate other countries.
