


Recent Development

■ CMM recovery reached 11.4 billion m³ in 2012, increased by 25.3% compared with that in 2011.














Comparison of CMM Drainage Volume in 2005 and 2011 of 8 Key State Owned Coal Mining Groups


■ Produced 2.7 billion m³ of CBM in 2012.







CBM Development Companies with CBM production




CBM production and utilization of 2012 in China
